Christ Church Oxford

Our coverage of events at Christ Church Cathedral from November 2018 to present was restricted to events in which the Church of England was directly involved and for which there was reliable source material.

- Christ Church Review Group, On 2 November 2023, the Church of England issued the Press Release Christ Church Review Group announced, extracts of which are reproduced below. The Review Group will oversee an independent review process of the handling of alleged safeguarding issues regarding the former Dean of Christ Church, Oxford, but will not be concerned with the wider issues between the former Dean and the College, (2 November 2023).
- Christ Church, Oxford, According to a report in the Church Times, the Governing Body of Christ Church has accepted in principle a proposal by Dominic Grieve KC that the Dean cease to be Head of House. According to the report, the Governing Body took an "indicative decision" on Wednesday to approve "a proposal to divide the responsibilities currently assigned to the Dean into two roles". A report in Cherwell notes:
- "Currently, the Dean has charge of a single Foundation comprising both a Cathedral and a College of the University of Oxford. In future, the Dean will only lead the Cathedral, working beside a separate head of the Foundation. In an e-mail sent to students, the College said: 'The proposal would enable future Deans of the Cathedral to dedicate themselves exclusively to leading the mission, ministry and management of the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Oxford, overseeing its prayer and worship.' Both institutions will, however, remain within the single Foundation of Christ Church Oxford, despite separate leadership of the College and Cathedral".

Professor Martyn Percy. A subsequent <u>statement</u> welcomed Dr Percy back to Cathedral duties. Also below is the <u>response</u> from the Bishop of Oxford. (21 August 2019).
 - On 21 August 2019, Christ Church, Oxford, issued a brief <u>communication</u> which stated "following a thorough investigation, the tribunal has decided that the charges are not upheld and that there is no cause to remove the Dean as Head of House". This was followed by a <u>statement</u> from The Rt Revd Dr Steven Croft, Bishop of Oxford. (19 August 2019).

Last week's round-up noted the Bishop of Oxford's statement that the Governing Body and Chapter had requested that the complaint against the Very Revd Professor Martyn Percy related to a college governance matter and was to be reviewed by an independently-chaired internal tribunal. An article in The Guardian had indicated that the Church of England was not involved in the tribunal and that there is no question of invoking the Clergy Disciplinary Measure.

Nevertheless, a tweet from the Archbishop Cranmer blog indicated that an "astonishing number of people are trashing the CofE for Martyn Percy's suspension as Dean of Christ Church Oxford", adding "It is *not* a church matter. (25 November 2018).
